Interpretation of Site	The stone wall enclosure and short drystone wall appear similar in construction (probably 1840-1860s), the long drystone wall is of different construction (a wire fence runs along top and appears younger - 1880s-1900). The plough also dates to this period. The earlier walls may relate to early occupation of Charlottes Plain run - shepards hut was said to be located in this area.

History

1840s: Part of Charlotte Plains run. 1850s and 60s: basalt quarry identified in the area. 1860s and 70s onward: lots sold off to rural farmers. Bought by quarry company and subsequently leased to farmers.
