Stone boiler setting would have supported a boiler up to 40 metres long and about 1.45
metres in diameter. The earthworks of the mill indicate a vertical breaking-down saw and a rip
bench were installed, with the sawdust descent to the creek along a trench 17 metres long

THOMAS PHILIPSON ESTABLISHED HIS "ALBION" SAWMILL IN APRIL 1871. HE SUPPLIED TIMBER TO ELMHURST, MOUNT COLE (WARRAK), ARARAT AND LANDSBOROUGH. THE MILL PROBABLY OPERATED UNTIL ABOUT 1880
