THE MILL IS BUILT ON A SMALL EXCAVATED TERRACE IN A SLOPE OVERLOOKING THE CREEK. A SINGLE CIRCULAR SAW BREAKING-DOWN BENCH AND A RIP BENCH WERE BUILT OVER THE SAME TRENCH. SAWDUST WAS PROBABLY DUMPED STRAIGHT INTO THE CREEK. A JINKER TRACK LEADS IN TO THE SITE FROM THE UPSTREAM SLOPE.

RICHARD WITNISH INSTALLED A SMALL SAWMILL ON THE EAST BRANCH OF THE DALE CREEK AT THE WESTERN FOOT OF MOUNT GREY. THE LOGS WERE JINKERED IN FROM THE EAST AND NORTHEAST. THE MILL WORKED UNTIL THE 1893 SLUMP.
