The ports and harbours buoy shed concrete slab is a remnant of the original pilot's coal shed and is associated with the pilot service. The site is used by local boatbuilders as a hard during boat maintenance. Medium significance.

Interpretation of Site	Concrete slab floor foundation of buoy shed. A buoy shed belonging to the ports and harbours dept was built here and appears on a plan produced by the public works dept. In 1973. The site was first used as a coal depot shed for the Port Phillip pilots, and was probably supplied by the fishermen's tramway link to the railway station.
