History

JAMES H WHEELER ESTABLISHED A SAWMILL IN THE HEAD OF KANGAROO CREEK IN 1871. A TRAMWAY WAS CONSTRUCTED FROM THE MILL NORTH TO THE DAYLESFORD-MALMSBURY ROAD. IT WAS BUILT ON THE PRINCIPAL AND STRINGER METHOD TO A GAUGE OF 5'3" AND OPERATED WING HORSE TEAMS. IN 1880 THE RAILWAY FROM CARLSRUHE TO DAYLESFORD WAS COMPLETED, CUTTING THROUGH WHEELER'S TRAMWAY ONLY ONE MILE NORTH OF THE MILL. THE TRAMWAY NORTH OF THE RAIL LINE WAS ABANDONED AND THE SOUTHERN SECTION DIVERTED INTO THE STATION YARD. THE MILL CLOSED IN 1892.
