The gardens are entered through masonry pillars which have been stuccoed. They are inscribed with the words "Lest We Forget", and contain plaques honouring 53 fallen district servicemen from World Wars I and II. There are two gates made from a popular wrought iron pattern. The fence is concrete posts with wire mesh commensurate in age and style with the gates.

The Chiltern Memorial Park entranceway comprise of stuccoed masonry pillars, inscribed with the words "Lest We Forget", and plaques honouring 53 fallen servicemen of the First and Second World Wars. The two gates are made from a popular wrought iron pattern while the fence is characterised by concrete posts with wire mesh, which matches in age and style with the gates.
