THEY BUILT THE HOUSE AND ASSOCIATED STRUCTURES. THE MUDBRICK HOUSE COMPRISED OF THREE BEDROOMS AND LOUNGE (TIN CHIMNEY). THE CORRUGATED IRON SHED WAS THE KITCHEN (LATER ADDITION) AND BESIDE IT WAS THE GARAGE/WORKSHOP. THERE USED TO BE A WALTHROUGH VERANDAH FROM THE HOUSE TO THE KITCHEN/BATHROOM.
