Interpretation of Site	THE BUILDING REFUSE COMPRISING THE SITE IS CONSISTENT WITH THE MATERIALS USED TO CONTRUCT THE 1880S "YALOK" HOMESTEAD ONTHE EAST SIDE OF GEELONG-BALLAN ROAD, SOUTH OF BALLAN. SOME BUILDING MATERIALS ARE ERODING FROM THE BANK OF THE GULLY IN WHICH THEY'RE DEPOSITED. THERE IS POTENTIAL FOR FURTHER MATERIAL TO BE PRESENT.

History

VALENTINE NOTT MOGG TOOK OVER THE YALOK VALE PASTORAL RUN IN 1873. A RELATIVE, MARCUS MASON MOGG, LATER PURCHASED ALLOTMENT 9 OF SECTION 15 FOR HIS HOUSE AFTER THE RUN WAS BUILT IN GRAND STYLE OF 1880S WITH TWO STOREY MANSION, STABLES, GARDENS ETC. MOGG WAS A SHIRE COUNCILLOR FROM 1892-1903 AND SHIRE PRESIDENT 1897-1899.
