UNOCCUPIED IN 1855 BUT BY 1864 A BUILDING IS ON THE LOT. THE ORIGINAL LANDHOLDER WAS JOHN YEWERS. BY 1877 THE BLOCK HAD BEEN SUB-DIVIDED INTO VERY SMALL ALLOTMENTS AND YEWERS LANE WAS CRETED. THE BUILDING IS SHOWN ON THE PLAN. THE BUILDING IS SHOWN ON THE 1895 AND 1910 MMBW PLAN. IT SEEMS TO BE A WOODEN BUIDLING WITH A VERANDAH. FROM THE SET AND ORIENTATION IT WAS PROBABLY THE FIRST HOUSE ON THE BLOCK FOR IT SEEMS TO BE ORIENTED TOWARDS WHITEHALL STREET.
