History

THE ASSOCIATED CHURCH AND VICARAGE WERE CONSTRUCTED IN 1863-65. THE FIRST BUILDING ON THIS SITE, A PARISH HALL KINDERGARTEN, WAS BUILT IN 1883. IN 1918 IT WAS REPLACED BY A SECOND, LARGER HALL. IN 1968 THE CHURCH WAS DEMOLISHED AND IN 1984 PART OF THE PARISH HALL WAS DESTROYED BY FIRE. THE SITE WAS LEVELLED AND USED AS A CAR PARK BY THE PARISHIONERS WHO NOW WORSHIP IN THE SURVIVING PORTION OF THE 1918 HALL.
