The site is significant because of the long-term use as a pipe-making factory of which a great deal of physical evidence of construction and finished product remains. It provides information regarding the construction of the Geelong Ovoid Sewer Aqueduct and the development of early infrastructure in Geelong.

Interpretation of Site	Site is the location of the pipe-making factory associated with the construction of the Ovoid Sewer and Barwon River Aqueduct. Factory was torn down in 1915; cement structures are the remnants of this factory. Railway reserve was used to dry newly moulded pipes.
