THE GRANTEE OF THE LAND WAS WF CLEELAND ON 27 1 1853 WHO PURCASHED 158 ACRES. CLEELAND WAS STILL LISTED ON THE RATES AS THE OWNER IN 1869. BY 1900, JOHN FOX WAS THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY; HE DIED IN 1901 AND HIS SON WILLIAM TOOK OVER THE FARM. IN THE 1950S THE PATERSON FAMILY PURCHASED THE PROPERTY.
