

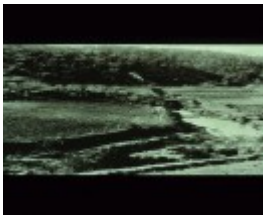

## History

There is a large photographic record of both Lake Daylesford and Central Springs. The Lake was constructed in the late 1920s and was built to flood gold mines in area as the gold diggings caused considerable disturbance to the landscape. The earliest historic photograph of Central Springs dates from the early 20th century. The Springs were most popular during the 1930s and 1940s. However they were likely to have been discovered in the 1850s.
