The Cobbler's Gully gold puddling site is a characteristic and well-preserved example of a site associated with the earliest forms of gold mining which, from 1851, played a pivotal role in the development of Victoria. Puddling machines' technology is particularly important in the history of Victorian gold mining as it represented the only technology or method developed entirely on Victorian goldfields.
