History

William Saffron was a shepherd who worked for Henry Meyrick at his station "Glenmaggie". Saffron died in about December 1846, and his age and cause of death were not recorded. He left a wife, Ellen, and three children, Catherine, James and baby Hanna. The death of Saffron was the last straw for Meyrick, who had great difficulty obtaining workers and was at a loss with what to do with Saffron's family. He decided to sell up, but was drowned just a few months later, in the Thomson River. Ellen Saffron remarried in 1847, to Edward Pender.
