History

Murrindal was a wayside coach stop for travellers between the Monaro and Gippsland. Three people are known to be buried here: William Thomas Connors, aged 6 months, died Jan 1885 of inflammation of the bowel. Born Monaro, NSW, parents Thomas Connors & Elizabeth Woodhouse. John Moore, aged 62 years, died 13 Feb 1872 after the wheel of a dray passed over him on the Murrindal-Buchan Road. A carpenter by trade. Andrew Patterson, aged 53 years, was a contractor working on the road when killed by a dynamite explosion at Murrindal in July 1891. He was married to Sarah Ward, and left 11 children.
