History

In 1882 John Dorran brought his family to Mallacoota and selected a large area of land. He immediately started to clear the two large headlands between Howe Flat and Allan Head, and at the same time commenced to build a large residence and hotel, named "Lake View". The hotel flourished in the Spotted Dog mining days, and was also popular with fishermen and tourists. The number of burials in the cemetery is unknown, but at least 7 names are known - James Smellie (1897), Sydney Mortimer (1898), John Frazer (1902), Peter Pearson (1908), J H Hodson (1912), John Dorron (1913), and C Brown (date unknown). It is believed that some miners from the

nearby Spotted Dog mine are buried here.
