Huts possibly date to 1846. Allotments 8 and 9, Parish of Yangery, County of Villiers purchased from the Crown by Thomas Manifold in 1847. Manifold occupied Grasmere, his home station, north along the Merri River. A 1922 plan shows sub-division of Manifolds Estate to form Wollaston Estate. The hut sites are not shown on this plan.
