## History

Baddaginnie was opened for passenger traffic on 19th February 1882 and for goods travel on 2nd April 1883. The passenger platform was located on the down side and on a straight road, the only station on the main line to do so. (Turton 1973:46.) The goods platofrm and shed were located on the other side of the tracks. In 1890 Baddaginnie was opened as a staff and telegraph
