History

Balmattum opened on 12th March 1889 as a timber siding surrounded by sawmills. On 2nd June a passenger

platform was opened on the up side the railway line. The station yard was rebuilt in 1916 and Balmattum became an electronic staff station (Waugh 1988:17). A goods shed and platform were completed in 1943 on the down side of the railway line. The station was closed as both a passenger and staff station on 24th July 1965 (Turton 1973:36).
