Interpretation of Site	May be the house built by James Mooney in the mid 1870s. Mooney claimed to have built a stone house 21x13 feet and stone sheep yards as well as other improvements to allotment 1A3. Mooney lived in the house in the mid 1870s, but the house was transferred to J R Learmouth in 1883

History

James Mooney, a labourer from nearby Ettrick was the original leasee of allotment 1A3. Under his lease he built 154 chains of stone wall, 6 chains of post and rail fence and 41 chains of log and brush fence. In addition he built a stone house measuring 21x13 feet consisting of two rooms and a skillion as well as a wooden bridge over Darlots Creek, stone sheep yards and had made a half-acre garden. The lease was transferred to J R Learmouth (who won a large amount of property in this area) in 1883. It is possible that this site is Mooney's 2 room house.
