Significant as the residential core of an early agricultural station in South Gippsland

Interpretation of Site	The northern section of the site contains the c1846-1906 homestead of the Buckley family and several supporting structures. The artefact scatter appears to be kitchen associated. The general outline of some Buckley-associated fencelines also survive subsurface. No archaeological evidence of the 1841-1842 Glengarry Settlement was identified.

History

Greenmount was first settled in 1841 by Aeneas McDonnell, the 16th Lord Glengarry, who hoped to import his highland clan to Gippsland. Glengarry left after only 12 months. After passing quickly through two other owners, it was purchased and settled by the Buckley family from 1845-46. Greenmount remained in the hands of the Bucleys until the estate was subdivided and sold off in 1906. The homestead appears to have been abandoned the same year, and was eventually demolished in 1938, although some related structures appear to have survived into the 2nd half of the century.
