Physical Description 1

A single storey mansion/villa addressing Auburn Road with a wide verandah which returns to what is now Rosslyn Street. The building's principal elevation can not be seen. Site inspection required. The side elevation presents a standard villa form with faceted bay wing projection and a hipped slate roof. The cast iron verandah is a timber frieze frame form with cast columns and cast brackets and straight.

The initially extensive side garden has been truncated by the subdivision of the property to form Rosslyn Street.
