130 Autumn Street is a typical, modest timber cottage of the 1850's era in Geelong West . It is an example of an asymmetrical gable which was relatively common at that time. It is of local significance.

Physical Description 1

DESCRIPTION

The single storey timber building is clad in weatherboards and has a corrugated iron clad roof and concave verandah. The gable ridge traverses the site and is extended at the rear. A brick chimney protrudes from the rear of the building and finials adorn the apex of the gable ends. The front elevation is asymmetrical with an off-center front door and double-hung windows either side.
