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## Physical Description 1

A double-fronted, hip-roofed, timber, generally symmetrical Italianate house. There are two canted bays expressed at the root with a verandah right around to a projecting wing at right side rear. There are impressive polychromatic brick chimneys, with deep brick mouldings, brackets and pots. There is an ogee gutter, eaves, moulding and ogee brackets. The verandah is bullnosed, with castiron lace valence and brackets, with turned Doric timber posts. The entry has a six-panelled door, with side and fanlights.
