## **Physical Description 1**

A timber, doublefronted Californian Bungalow, with a gable roof across. The right bay projects as a gable, over the verandah. The upper gable has a rectangular vent and timbering over shingles splaying, supported on bullnosed brackets, all on tuckpointed brick piers and balustrade. The entrance has a sidelight. The chimney is detached, with a terracotta pot. A skillion side windowhood is supported on timber brackets.
