## Physical Description 1

A double-fronted brick Californian Bungalow with a gable-roof facing. The roof has Marseilles unglazed terracotta tiles and bricks are deep brown speckled with two red string course bands. The right bay projects. Upper gables jetty slightly with Medievalising timbers on miniature triple bull-nosed brackets. Chicago windows project with flat hoods, with leadlight upper sashes in a rose patter. At right side, the verandah is fully recessed before another gable. This has Medievalising brackets on posts over brick piers with flat hoods with mock shingles on bull-nosed brackets.
