History

In 1882 John Dorran brought his family to Mallacoota and selected a large area of land. He immediately started to

clear the two large headlands between Howe Flat and Allan Head, and at the same time commenced to build a large residence and hotel, named "Lake View". The hotel flourished in the Spotted Dog mining days, and was also popular with fishermen and tourists.
