STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

A characteristic Edwardian timber house with some Art Nouveau decorative elements built in 1915. It is architecturally significant as representative of this domestic style and historically significant in embodying life in Newtown immediately prior to the Great War.

VISUAL DESCRIPTION A triplefronted, gableroofted timber Edwardian house. Bays project at centre and right side rear. Upper gables jetty on ogee brackets, clad with timbered drip ple iron. The porch is in the angle, over which the roof extends as a hip. It has a palisade frieze, with an Art Nouveau fretwork panel with a lyre motif over a rail with fretwork eaved, sinuously curved brackets with a fleur-de-lis motif. The chimney has a tunnel vaulted pot. COMPARATIVE ALISIS
The lyre decorative motif also occurs at ref 192 n033 and 191 no36.
