

Physical Description 1

It is a single storey house set close to the street boundary on a small block. The front part is built of brick and cement rendered. It has a hipped roof which is clad in corrugated iron. The front elevation is symmetrical with a central front and a single-hung window on wither side. The verandah is a later addition and the cast iron lace valance on the verandah dates from circa 1880. The rear part is built of timber and clad in weatherboards. It also has a hipped roof clad in corrugated iron. A third part which may have been added circa 1920 is clad in weatherboards and has a skillion roof with corrugated iron. On the south elevation is a small window with a delightful window hood.
