STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

16 Beach Parade is an outstanding example of a bungalow style house with the unusual rough cast wall treatment and an excellent degree of integrity. It is of local significance.

Physical Description 1

Description

In 1921 the property was described as a seven room brick dwelling. It is single storey and the brickwork has been covered in rough-cast. The roof is composed of a series of gables clad in terra cotta with two of the gable room projecting from it and the remainder of the gable has a small verandah across it. The front window hood and the verandah have terra cotta roofs. The whole of the wall surface is rough cast except for the string courses at head-height and sill height and below the latter. The verandah is supported by tapered pillars and a balustrade is between them. The integrity of the house is excellent and includes the wire fence and gate and the garden paths.

The style is fairly typical of bungalows in Geelong West however its use of rough cast and the excellent degree of integrity combine to make it an outstanding example of the style.
