## Physical Description 1

This small brick-church was constructed and designed by S.H. Lugg, a carpenter as the Bible Christian Church.

This is a very simple one roomed church with a 45 degree angle gable roof matching entrance vestibule. The original polychrome face brickwork has now, unfortunately, been painted. The gable end is divided into three by vertical brick strips intersecting a horizontal string course suggesting the base of a pediment and raking up the slope of the gable a course of angled bricks suggestive of the Lombardic treatment used in other primitive Methodist Church such as at Caledonia Gully, Bendigo. The pediment is pierced by a circular window, originally surrounded by a circle of contrasting coloured bricks and an arched label mould above. This is surmounted by a small arched headed ventilator. The building has simple arch headed window openings with a plain brick label mould following the curve and continuing as a horizontal impost mould right around the building, broken only at the pilasters.
