Physical Description 1

DESCRIPTION

The single storey timber house is clad in weatherboards and the hipped and gabled roof is clad in corrugated iron. It is essentially Edwardian in design with a small tower and turret. Similar turrets and broad window hoods can be seen on many other timber houses of this period, in The Esplanade and in Villamanta Street.
