Memorial Window Description & Emp; History

One of a series of five windows in the apsidal baptistry that were the gift of the 'Ladies of H.M.A.S. Cerberus in memory of A.C.C. Lost in the Second World War'. The series began with the *Baptism of Christ* and depicted Jesusand John the Baptist by the Jordan River, heralding the start of his ministry.

The window was one of the many designed by David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988) for the Louis R. Williams' designed chapel and installed from 1954. Kellock was an Edinburgh-trained stained glass artist who immigrated to Australia before the Second World War.
