# **Memorial Window Description & Emp; History**

One of a series of five windows in the apsidal baptistry that were the gift of the 'Ladies of H.M.A.S. Cerberus in memory of A.C.C. Lost in the Second World War'. *Suffer Little Children* was installed as the central window of the series and the only one to include a text.

The window was one of many designed by David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988) for the Louis R. Williams designed chapel and installedfrom 1954. Kellock was an Edinburgh-trained stained glass artist who immigrated to Australia prior to the Second World War.
