Memorial Window Description & History

One of a series of five windows in the apsidal baptistry that were the gift of the 'Ladies of H.M.A.S. *Cerberus* in memory of A.C.C. Lost in the Second World War'. The last in the series pictured *St. Christopher*, patron of travellers and, as he was invoked against tempest, water and plague, was believed to watch over sailors.

The window was one of many designed by David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988) for the Louis R. Williams designed chapel and installed from 1954. Kellock immigrated to Australia prior to the Second World War.
