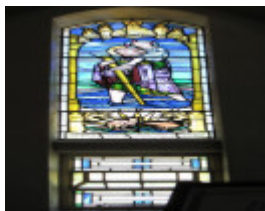
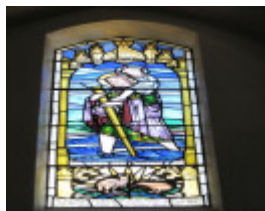
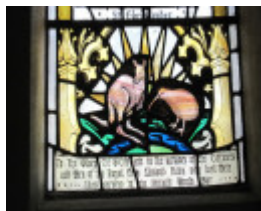

St. Christopher

Memorial Window Inscription

To the Glory of God and to the memory of the Officers and Men of the Royal New Zealand Navy who lost their lives serving in the Second World War.

Memorial Window Description & History

Not only is this the second window with *St. Christopher* as the subject, but it is also almost next to its namesake, just around the corner from the baptistry. Presented to the Chapel by the New Zealand Naval Board as a tribute to the Royal New Zealand Navy, it featured a base panel that depicted a kangaroo and a kiwi side by side, with the rising sun in the background, thus representing the cooperative alliance between Australia and New Zealand in times of war. The window was dedicated at the morning service on 18 November 1956, the first Sunday after Remembrance Day.

The window was one of many designed by David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988) for the Louis R. Williams designed chapel, installed from 1954. Kellock was an Edinburgh-trained stained glass artist who immigrated to Australia prior to the Second World War.
