Memorial Window Description & History

David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988) designed the *Crucifixion* with the various symbols of Christ's Passion surrounding him. Although there was no plaque or inscription on the window the guide to the Chapel's windows and memorials indicates that this was a 'Memorial to Small Ships lost in the Second World War'.

The window was one of many that Kellock designed for architect, Louis R. Williams' Chapel of St. Mark at Crib Point that were installed from 1954. Kellock, an Edinburgh-trained stained glass artist, immigrated to Australia prior to the Second World War.
