## Memorial Window Description & History

One of the many windows ordered for Flinders Naval Depot Chapel was a rose overlooking the altar, selected as a memorial to HMAS. *Perth*. The window was expected to cost about £320 and a large part of the sum was derived from royalties on the first edition of a book on the Perth's exploits, *Age Shall Not Weary Them*, written by former Petty Officer RG Roberts. An appeal for the remaining funds was launched and donations accepted by Chaplain, the Reverend Herbert E Fawell at Flinders Naval Depot, Crib Point (Vic.). By November 1952, the Lord Mayor of Perth, closed the appeal as sufficient funds were subscribed and Rev. Fawell announced that the order had been placed with the artist, David Taylor Kellock (1913-1988). The rose window was favoured as an architectural element for Louis Williams' churches and this example can be compared with others at All Saints' Anglican Chapel, Geelong Grammar School at Corio and St. Andrew's Anglican Church, Brighton.
