Memorial Window Description & History

On 17 March 1926, the Reverend Hudson, Chaplain at Flinders Naval Depot, ordered a window from Brooks, Robinson & Co., Melbourne, measuring 76 x 32 inches and depicting *Paul Casting Anchor*. A new cartoon was prepared and new ornamental canopy and base work designed for the window. The ornamentation would be replicated in its companion window, *Christ Stilling the Storm*, ordered three months later.

The Navy League was a patriotic organisation dedicated to supporting the RN and perpetuating the tradition of Trafalgar. Before the outbreak of war in 1914 it recognised the rise of German seapower and was intent on 'the education of public opinion upon the vital necessity to the British people of the maintenance of a supreme fleet'. In the post-war period it assisted returned seamen and their families.
