Memorial Window Description & History

Chaplain at Flinders Naval Depot, the Reverend Hudson ordered a window measuring 76 x 27 inches from Brooks, Robinson & Co. on 12 December 1925. The figure of *St. Peter* was taken from an earlier cartoon, made up for Christ Church, St. Kilda, adapted to suit the size of window opening and designed with an ornamental canopy to match that above the figure of *St. Paul* that Hudson had ordered a few months earlier.

HMS *Delhi*, a light cruiser of the Royal Navy, was sent to Australia as part of an exchange program where it was to be attached to the Royal Australian Navy for six monthss, at the same time that HMAS *Melbourne* sailed in the Mediterranean Sea with the Malta Squadron of the RN. It sailed into Sydney harbour in January 1926 under the command of Captain KEL Creighton MVO, and had already sailed in Australian waters as part of the Special Service Squadron visit in 1924.
