Memorial Window Description & Emp; History

In November 1920, the Reverend CM Love was considering installing a two-light memorial window, which stained glass artist William Montgomery estimated at 130 guineas. Montgomery did not have a 'catalogue' as did the commercial firms, and instead he forwarded a parcel of watercolour designs to Mr EF Burston, the Hon. Treasurer at Holy Trinity Church, Stawell in July 1921. Unusually, he also sent a full sized cartoon of *St. George* to give a better idea of the finished window. Montgomery received instructions to proceed with the work at the end of July 1921. An account for £140.15.0, issued to EF Burston on 31 January 1922, was paid in full at the end of March. The window is signed 'W. Montgomery' in the lower margin.
