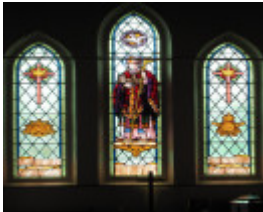

### **Memorial Window Description & History**

The nave of the Anglican church at Kaniva was re-hallowed and the sanctuary, vestry and memorial gifts were unveiled and dedicated by Archdeacon Joseph Best of Ballarat in 1940. Archdeacon Best had served as a Chaplain in the AIF during the First World War. Mathieson & Gibson installed a series of twelve windows in the nave and presented the gift of a porch window. The west window of *St. Augustine*, was flanked by quarry windows set with the AIF badge in the First World War window and the RAAF badge above the inscription for the Second World War.
