# Memorial Window Description & Description & Amp; History

On the same day in June 1950 that the Reverend CDH Pilkington ordered six windows for the nave and porch of St. John's Church, Lang Lang, he also ordered a 36-inch diameter window with the symbol of Victory over Death at its centre, the *Cross and Crown*. It was later incorporated into the new church designed by Melbourne diocesan architect, Louis R Williams that opened in 1959. The window was the gift of the Pardew family in memory of the men of the parish who sacrificed their lives while serving in the Second World War.
