[Plaque] In proud memory of those from St. John's Camberwell who served in two Great Wars 1914-1918 1939-1945.

Memorial Window Description & History

St. Aidan is one of a set of three memorial windows in the narthex dedicated to the men from the parish who served in the First and Second World Wars. The text was chosen to pay tribute to those from the parish who joined the Air Force.

Stained glass artist, Mervyn Napier Waller, was commissioned to design and make the windows in 1961, a few years after he had completed the major memorial of fifteen lights for the Hall of Memory, Australian War Memorial, Canberra.

A Book of Remembrance was set below in a glass case, a single page open, with each name simply written without rank, unit or honour.
