Memorial Window Description & History

The order for 'six windows' for St. Stephen's Church, was placed with Brooks, Robinson & Co. by Mr. T. Watson in November 1947; each light measured 76 x 20 inches approximately. Each light pictured a Biblical hero, with *Christ* in the central position and the outer lights included the service badges of the A.I.F., Navy, Merchant Navy and Air Force. The large stained glass memorial window was unveiled by Lieutenant Colonel SAF Pond on Sunday 29 August 1948. It commemorated twelve men who lost their lives while serving in the Second World War. Among those assembled for the unveiling were Chaplain-General A.H. Stewart who also delivered the address, Mr. Dennett, the Minister for Agriculture and the Mayor and councillors of the City of Caulfield.
