History

The cordial manufactory was established and owned by Henry Last in 1851. The Villamanta Ward Rate Book (1852) lists the building as a two roomed dwelling and shop. Last owned the cordial factory until his death in 1853. That same year Pattison and Talbot purchased the business and ran it until the late 19th century. The shop was expanded to a five roomed weatherboard building in 1853.

In 1891, the Hopetoun Chambers was built on the site for prominent local figure G.F.Belcher, designed by Geelong architects Watts and Durran in Late Victorian Classical style.
