## **Statement of Significance**

This place is included on the Victorian Heritage Inventory, foritspotential to contain historical archaeological remains associated with the settlement and growth of early Ballarat. Under the terms of the Heritage Act 2017 there is protection for all historical archaeologysites and objects in the state.

As the result of Gov Hub preparatory excavation works at 106 Market Street Ballarat Central, approximately 15,000 historical artefacts were uncovered from the northeast corner of the site. Initial views suggest the archaeological remains likely comprise of a refuse or rubbish layer that has been deposited across the site and extending into the adjacent streets (Armstrong Street North). The site has potentially served as a civic tip or dump site at some time, or the material may have been introduced as a 'levelling fill' prior to later construction. The nature of the artefactual remains attributes the fill to the goldrush years, c. 1850-1870s with minimal modern disturbance to the north east corner of the site. No further archaeological remains of structures, foundations or other features were identified. This site demonstrates a medium level of archaeological significance.
