STATEMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE:

What is significant?

This large *Eucalyptus globulus* (Blue Gum) located on a road verge at the corner of Londsdale Street and Thompson Street, Hamilton.

How is it significant?

This *Eucalyptus globulus* is significant for scientific reasons and for its contribution to landscape at the Regional level.

Why is it significant?

This *Eucalyptus globulus* is outstanding for its size, with a height of 22m and spread of 25m and girth of 6.8m. The tree is in a prominent location at the main entrance to Hamilton and makes a significant contribution to the landscape of the town. It is the last remaining Blue Gum of a row planted along Lonsdale Street in 1880.
