'Woodlands', a single storey stuccoed brick villa at 354 Ryrie Street, Geelong, was erected prior to 1855 for Andrew Glenn in the then popular Australian colonial style. In 1868 architect John Young executed alterations

and in 1878 Joseph Watts, architect, designed the Italianate double bay window replacing the original verandah to Ryrie Street. Woodlands is a notable Geelong villa, sensitively altered since erection in the 1850s and of significance as the residence of Geelong businessman William Burrows 1858-1878 and W. C. Kernot 1904-1966.

Early house altered in late Victorian period (1878) with original verandah to front replaced by 2 projecting bays. Rendered with basalt plinth, hipped roof clad in slate, decorative bracket to eaves. Now has central recessed entry with tiled deck, cast iron frieze & balustrade in timber frames, timber concave verandah to each side with timber valance, arched sash windows to bays. 4 panelled timber door with highlight & sidelights, rendered chimneys with decorative brackets.
